RESOLUTION : As per the guidelines of the Government of India in respect of the Minimum Needs Programme, there should be one Primary Health Centre for every rural population of 30,000 in Non-Tribal areas and for every 20,000 population for Tribal, hilly and inaccessible areas. Though the goal of "Health for All" is to be achieved by the year 2000 A.D., the State Government has decided to achieve this target by 1991. According to the Government of India guidelines, it is necessary to have about 1559 Primary Health Centres in Maharashtra. As against this, there are 705 Primary Health Centres in existence at present, leaving a backlog of 834 Primary Health Centres. Government has since decided to sanction these 834 Primary Health Centres.

2. The concept of providing health infrastructure in rural areas as accepted by the Planning Commission, envisages a four tier system i.e. Sub-Centre, Primary Health Centre, Rural Hospital, and a District Head Quarter Hospital. It is, thus, necessary to redesignate or convert as far as possible the existing health institutions other than those mentioned above appropriately. With this view and with a view to making most-cost-effective-use of resources and effective coverage by Primary Health Centres of the rural population, Government has decided to upgrade suitable existing Health Institutions into Primary Health Centres, and to establish new Primary Health Centres only where such institutions are not available for upgradation.

3. Government is accordingly pleased to sanction establishment of 834 Primary Health Centres i.e. 764 in Non-Tribal areas and 70 in Tribal Sub-Plan areas. Out of the 764 Primary Health Centres to be established in Non-Tribal areas 497 will be by upgradation of the existing institutions and 267 by establishment of new Primary Health

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Centres as indicated in Statement 'D' accompanying this Resolution, Out of the 70 Primary Health Centres to be established in Tribal Sub-Plan areas; 40 will be by upgradation of the existing institutions while 30 will be by establishing new Primary Health Centres as indicated in Statement 'C' accompanying this Resolution. The districtw. allocation of these 834 Primary Health Centres is as shown in the Statement 'A' appended.

4. The staffing pattern of a new Primary Health Centre is as follows :-

In addition to the above staff, 263 existing posts of M.M. & H.S. Class III Officers in Non-Tribal areas and 20 posts of M.M. & H.S. Class-III Officers in Tribal Sub-Plan areas should also be upgraded with effect from 1st March 1984 to those of M.M. & H.S. Class-II Medical Officers in the pay scale as mentioned against Serial No.1 in the Statement above. These upgraded posts should be treated as newly created and temporary addition to the M.M. & H.S. Class II Cadre.

5. The location of the 764 Primary Health Centres in Non-Tribal areas and 70 Primary Health Centres in Tribal Sub-Plan areas and the staff sanctioned therefor is as indicated in Statements 'B' & 'C' respectively.

6. The posts should be created with effect from the 1st March 1984 upto and inclusive of 23th February 1985 in the first instance. The incumbents of the posts will be eligible for usual pay and allowances as are admissible under the rules.

7. Sanction is also accorded to the purchase of 762 vehicles for these Primary Health Centres at an estimated cost of Rs.25,000/- each.

8. With a view that the expenditure is accommodated within the funds available during 1983-84 and that are likely to be available during 1984-85, Government is pleased to direct that during 1983-84, 677 vehicles i.e. 58 for T.S.P. areas and 619 for Non-Tribal areas and equipment and material (at an estimated cost not exceeding Rs.2500 for each Primary Health Centre) should be purchased. The remaining vehicles and appointment of staff should be

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so phased during 1984-85 that the expenditure is accommodated within the grants that will be sanctioned therefor in the Budget Estimates for 1984-85. The Director of Health Services is authorised to take appropriate action accordingly in the matter.

9. The expenditure on this account during 1983-84 should be met from the Contingency Fund Advances of Rs.4.56 Crores and Rs.47 lakhs sanctioned under Government Memoranda Finance Department No.CNF/1184/183/BUD-2 dated 2nd Feb. 1984 and No.CNF/1184/184/BUD-2 dated the 2nd Feb. 1984 for Non-Tribal and Tribal Sub-Plan areas respectively and should be finally debited to the budget head "282-Public Health Sanitation & Water Supply-A-Public Health and Sanitation (a) Minimum Needs Programme-Schemes in the Five Year Plan (i) Grants for Plan Scheme under Section 187 of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act 1961 (282-202-4)" Demand No.192 as far as the Non-Tribal areas are concerned and to the Budget head "282-Public Health Sanitation & Water Supply-Schemes in the Five Year Plan-Tribal areas Sub-Plan-A-Public Health & Sanitation (iii) Minimum Needs Programme (1) Grant-in-aid to Zilla Parishads under Section 187 of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act 1961-(a) State Plan Schemes - (282-202-2)" Demand No.167.

10. The amount of the Contingency Fund advances of Rs.4.56 Crores & Rs.47 lakhs is hereby placed at the disposal of the Director of Health Services, Bombay. While incurring the expenditure from the Contingency Fund advance, the procedure prescribed under Government Circular, Finance Department, No.CNF/1983/140/BUD-3 dated the 26th April 1983 should be strictly followed. In the event, it is necessary to reduce the Contingency Fund Advances, the Director of Health Services Bombay, should see that necessary proposals are submitted to Government well in advance.

11. The Director of Health Services, Bombay, should see that the necessary orders for purchasing the vehicles as also equipment are placed in the matter immediately and see that they are procured immediately and in any case prior to the 31st March 1984.

12. Government is also pleased to authorise the Director of Health Services, Bombay, to withdraw the requisite amount on A. C. Bill from the Pay & Accounts Officer, Bombay, or from the Treasury as the case may be as a special case.

13. This Resolution issues with the concurrence of the Tribal Development Department, Planning Department and the Finance Department-vide Finance Department un-official
