Resolution:- The Minimum Needs Programme for Rural Health Services incorporated in the Sixth Five Year Plan, 1980-85, envisages establishment of one Sub-Centre for every 5000 rural population in Non-Tribal areas and 3000 in Tribal Sub-Plan areas and appointment of one Female Supervisor for every four Sub-Centres. Accordingly during the Sixth Five Year Plan period 3000 Sub-Centres are to be established out of which 1650 Sub-Centres have been established so far, in Tribal and Non-Tribal areas. It has been decided to establish 700 Sub-Centres i.e. 500 in Non-Tribal areas and 200 in Tribal Sub-Plan areas during 1983-84.

2. Sanction is hereby accorded to establish 500 Sub-Centres in Non-Tribal areas during 1983-84, district-wise allocation of which is as given in columns 2 and 3 of the appended statement.

3. Sanction is also accorded to the creation of 500 posts of Auxiliary Nurse Midwives in the pay scale of Rs.290-10-390-15-465-Extn-15-540 with allowances as admissible under the rules, and 500 posts of Part-time Attendants on the fixed pay of Rs.50/- per month, i.e. one for each Sub-Centre, for a period upto 29th February 1984, in the first instance.

4. Sanction is also accorded to the creation of 125 posts of Female Supervisors (Lady Health Visitor) the district-wise allocation of which is as mentioned in column 4 of the appended statement, in the pay scale of Rs.365-15-500-20-660-Extn-20-760 with allowances as admissible under the rules for a period upto 29th February, 1984.

5. The duties and responsibilities of the Female Supervisor will be:-

- i) The Female Supervisor will promote and supervise proper health care and maintenance of equipment and supplies;

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- (ii) She will guide A.N.M.s. and supervise the domiciliary practices;
- iii) She will undertake responsibilities for day-to-day supervision of Nursing and Midwifery Services in the area;
- iv) She will help to maintain and keep up-to-date records and reports;
- v) She will help to arrange the duties of the staff;
- vi) She will carry out and supervise health education activities concerning Maternal Child Health services; and
- vii) She will provide public Health nursing services in her jurisdiction.

Sanction is further accorded to the expenditure of Rs.20 lakhs at the rate of Rs.4000/- per Sub-Centre towards recurring contingencies and Rs.15 lakhs at the rate of Rs.3000/- per Sub-Centre towards purchase of equipment and material.

7. Orders regarding deciding the locations will issue later.

8. This is a 100% Centrally Sponsored Scheme. The Director of Health Services, Bombay, should see that the Central assistance is claimed accordingly in time.

9. The expenditure on this account is debitable to the budget head "282-Public Health Sanitation and Water Supply-A-Public Health and Sanitation (a) Minimum Needs Programme-Schemes in the Five Year Plan-(iii) Grants for Plan Schemes under Section 187 of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act, 1961 Centrally Sponsored Scheme" under Demand No.192 and should be met from the grants sanctioned thereunder during the current financial year.

10. This Resolution issues with the concurrence of the Planning Department and the Finance Department vide Finance Department's un-official-references No.CR-42/EXP-12, dated the 19th January 1983.
