RESOLUTION : Under the revised minimum needs programme for
rural health services incorporated in the Sixth Five Year Plan
(1980-1985) establishment of sub-centres on the basis of one
for every 5000 population has been indicated; which coverage
should be achieved by 1990. Sub-Centres form the grass roots
in the delivery of comprehensive health care to the needy
rural and tribal community. 3000 additional sub-centres during
the period of Five Year Plan 1980-85 are to be established.
So far 300 sub-centres have been established leaving balance
of 2700 sub-centres to be established upto 1984-85. In view
of Commission's decision during 1981-82 350 sub-centres and in
1982-83, 1000 sub-centres ^{are} to be established.

2. Sanction is, therefore, accorded to established 350
sub-centres and the creation of 350 posts of Auxiliary Nurse
Midwives in the pay scale of Rs. 290-10-390-Extn-15-340 + allowance
(Dearness allowances, H.R.A., Uniform Allowance & Washing
allowance) as admissible and 350 posts of Attendants on a
fixed pay of Rs. 50/- p.m. as shown in the accompanying statement

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Since this is a centrally assisted scheme under the Minimum Needs Programme pay and allowance of the A.N.M. part-time Attendant and recurring and non-recurring expenditure will be reimbursed by the Government of India. The financial requirements for 350 sub-centres will be as follows:-
(Rs. in lakhs)

1. Creation of 350 posts of A.N.M. (Pay & Allowances for 6 months)	18.90
2. Creation of 350 posts of Attendants on fixed pay of Rs.50/- p.m.	
3. Purchase of medicines @ Rs.1000/- Sub-Centre (for six months).	3.50
4. Purchase of equipments @ Rs.2,000/- per sub-centre.	7.00

The expenditure on this account should be debited to the budget head "282-Public Health-Sanitation and Water supply-A-Public Health-Sanitation-(a) Direction and Administration (a)(xiii) Grants for Plan schemes under section 187 of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad & Panchayat Samiti Act-1961" Demand No.80 and met from the provision made thereunder by withdrawing Contingency Fund advance under Finance Department Memo No. CNF.1102/303 BUD-G dated the 5th March 1982. The grants are not payable to the Zilla Parishads in cash but are adjustable against the ways and means advances sanctioned by the Rural Development Department.
