RESOLUTION.—From the Collectors' replies to Government Circular Memorandum No. BND. 1354, dated 31st July 1954, Government has noticed that there is no uniformity regarding the recovery of supervision charges for Boundary work from the land holders. According to Government Resolution, No. 646, dated 25th January 1894, the amount to be recovered for the repairs of Boundary marks should be governed by the charges actually incurred, including salary and expenses of any officer whom it may be necessary to employ for the purpose so far as those charges are reasonable and no charges should be imposed on the land holders which would not be incurred if the work were being done at Government expense. ~~As inspection of Boundary marks is one of the many duties of circle inspectors and talatis, Government is pleased to direct in modification of the Government Resolution of 25th January 1894 that no part of the salary and expenses of these officers should be recovered as supervision charges from the land holders even if they are specially or exclusively employed for the purpose.~~
