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(ii) who have attempted or comprised to escape from legal or judicial custody ;

(iii) who are security risk ;

(iv) who are specially dangerous and pose grave escape risk by use of violence ;

(v) who are held in custody for terrorists and destructive activities ;

(vi) who are held for smuggling and other organised crimes relating to bottlegging or narcotic drugs ;

(vii) who are foreign nationals with specially high escape risk, such prisoners may be confined by the concerned Superintendent of the Prison, in irons for a period not exceeding three months at a time.

(2) For application of irons to such prisoners beyond the period of three months, the concerned Superintendent of the Prison shall seek, in writing prior permission of the Inspector General of Prisons giving full circumstances for the need for such application beyond the period of three months, enclosing a medical report reflecting on the health of the prisoner confined in irons."

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CONSTITUTION OF INDIA.

No. EST.1285/2600/CR-738/37.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Maharashtra is hereby pleased to make the following rules regulating recruitment to the post of Draftsman, Class III in the Directorate of Ground Water Surveys and Development Agency under the Rural Development Department of the Government of Maharashtra, namely :—

1. These rules may be called the Draftsman in the Directorate of Ground Water Surveys and Development Agency (Recruitment) Rules, 1988.

2. Appointment to the post of Draftsman shall be made either—

(a) by promotion of a suitable person on the basis of seniority subject to fitness from amongst the persons holding the posts of Tracer in the said Directorate for a period of not less than three years.

OR

(b) by nomination from amongst candidates who, —

(i) unless already in the service of the Government of Maharashtra are not more than 28 years of age and ;

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(ii) possess a degree of a statutory university or a diploma of an Institution recognised by the Government of Maharashtra in Civil/Mechanical/ Electrical Engineering.

3. Appointment by promotion and by nomination shall be made in the ratio of 75:25.

4. A person appointed to the post shall be required to pass the Departmental examination and examinations in Hindi and Marathi according to the rules made in that behalf, unless he has already passed, or has been exempted from passing those examinations.

5. A person appointed to the post shall be liable to be transferred anywhere in the State of Maharashtra.

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CONSTITUTION OF INDIA.

No. MTR. 1088/CR-181/TRY-4.—In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (2) of article 283 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Maharashtra is hereby pleased to make the following rules further to amend the Maharashtra Treasury Rules, 1968, namely :—

1. These rules may be called the Maharashtra Treasury (First Amendment) Rules, 1989.

2. In the Maharashtra Treasury Rules, 1968, in Rule 156,—

(a) for the portion beginning with the words "The head of an office" and ending with the words "disbursing officer concerned.", the following shall be substituted, namely :—

"The head of an office may authorise any Gazetted Officer serving under him to sign a bill and to communicate his name and specimen signature to the disbursing officer concerned."

(b) at the end, the following Notes shall be added, namely :—

Note 1.—If the Head of an office is required to sign the bills, due to the absence of the officer to whom he has authorised to sign the bill under this rule, he shall intimate to the Treasury Officer the period, stating the inclusive dates, during which he, himself, would sign the bills.

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
